## Dragon's Fire 'unique name' for Carlisle golf course

Dragon's Fire Golf Club. It's not the type of name you would normally associate with a golf facility.

But if Bryan DeCunha is right, it's the type of name you won't be able to forget.

For months the golf course DeCunha has been building on Eighth Concession in Carlisle has been known simply as Namethecourse.com.

Now that the course is virtually done, DeCunha has taken the plunge.

"I know it's very different, a very unique name for a golf course, not the type of name you would expect," said DeCunha, who admitted he's talked to people who love it and others who hate it. "People will remember the name Dragon's Fire."

Owner DeCunha and designer Boris Danoff had a number of media and area golf course owners up to have a look at the place last week.

Seeding on the course began in late August and was concluded a couple of weeks ago. The fall growing season has been remarkable and the grass is already thick and lush.

"We're bang on target to open in May," said DeCunha, who was a co-owner of Royal Ontario in Oakville before he sold his portion to Ignat Kaneff.

"I went to church every Sunday to make sure we had the right weather. And we had the best golf course builders in Canada, perhaps in the world, Evans Golf. They've built some of the best courses in Canada."

The course is built on an old tree farm and Danoff has delivered a layout that appears to have used the land to its best advantage.
